When law enforcement officers demonstrate their love for their community members, it strengthens bonds and helps us build a Stronger, Safer Florida."

Sheriff Rick Wells designated Jeremiah an honorary deputy during a recent visit to MCSO. After the welcome greeting and designation, Jeremiah helped MCSO deputies train K-9s and even learned some K-9 commands. Jeremiah also learned about the MCSO SWAT BearCat vehicle. During the visit, MCSO presented Jeremiah with an authentic badge and a bicycle to use on patrol.
