Attorney General Ashley Moody News Release



TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Ashley Moody is praising the Florida House for unanimously passing legislation that will help advance the state's opioid litigation. The Florida House today passed HB 1253, sponsored by Representative Amber Mariano on a 111-0 vote. The legislation would allow the Attorney General's Office to access limited information from Florida's Prescription Drug Monitoring Database.

The limited information would be used, under protective order, in the state's ongoing litigation against the nation's largest opioid distributors, manufacturers and pharmacies to help further prove the corporations' roles in the opioid crisis that is claiming 17 lives a day in Florida.

Attorney General Ashley Moody said, "A vote for this bill is a vote for the Florida families and communities devastated by the opioid crisis. There is not a corner of our state that has not been ravaged by the death and destruction caused by opioid abuse. I want to thank House Speaker Josè Oliva, Representative Chris Sprowls, bill sponsor Representative Amber Mariano and each and every member of the Florida House who voted to pass this vital piece of legislation. I know that by working together we will hold responsible the entities that helped fuel the opioid crisis that is killing 17 people a day in our state."

Representative Amber Mariano said, "I want to thank Attorney General Moody for her unwavering commitment to fighting the opioid crisis. Families across Florida have felt the devastating effects of opioid abuse, and this legislation will help the state win its case to hold responsible the companies that profited off of the pain and suffering of Florida families."
